Milan, 12th *Octob.*, 1771

The cleric Herr Troger² has made your teeth water³ for Italy much too much, and I assure you that for people who have not seen the things in the world that you have seen, [5] there is indeed much that is special to be seen; but for you, these are no special curiosities and Italy will always be there; yes, one must on this occasion steal what one wishes to see now, and suffer the greatest inconvenience, yes, perhaps even risking one's life,⁴ if one insists on paying the penalty for one's inquisitiveness. [10] When I have more time I will write telling you about one thing or another. Most of it ultimately has the purpose of entertaining the populace: horse races; setting up a garden in a broad street with green *avenues*; allowing the populace to plunder heaps of victuals;⁵ to marry off 100 peasant girls and give them a public banquet in the said *avenue* laid out in the public street – [15] these are the things that some people will pay an arm or a leg to see.

The Archduke,⁶ his bride,⁷ the court, the theatre: these are things which last forever and can always be seen.

- Yesterday there was the 4th stage rehearsal of the *serenata*.⁸ Tomorrow there will be the 7th rehearsal for *Sgr. Sassone*,⁹ and on Monday the last rehearsal for Wolfgang because of the scenes. [20]

Baron Duping¹⁰ accompanied Nannerl with the violin, as he told us. The Duke of York¹¹ is already here. A Prince of Saxen Gotta.¹² The Crown Prince, ¹³ namely the father, and the mother of the Princess bride have also arrived. Count Sauerau¹⁴ is also here. People are swarming everywhere, [25] and one will have to suffer the greatest inconvenience to see everything.

They have laid down the finest regulations: that common people cannot carry a sword or any other weapon; that all persons are recorded accurately at the gates, and that all householders must hand in descriptions of those residing in their houses to a specially formed

commission; no-one may walk the streets at night without a light. [30] Soldiers and *sbirri*¹⁵ patrol in the town, and the hussars outside the town etc. etc.

Whether for the *opera*, ¹⁶ *serenade*, *ball*, court banquet, or any other *spectacles*, one must have *tickets etc. etc.* I must finish, for we have to read through the 2 *scores* of the *serenade* [35] which were copied in haste for His Majesty the Emperor and for the Archduke and still have to be bound, since there is much to be *corrected*, for the Italian *copyists* are terrifyingly inaccurate. We kiss both of you many 100000 times and I am as always your

On the evening of the 15th the Archduke will arrive, then the *wedding* takes place; after the wedding hand-kissing at court, then 2 hours of music, then the meal. – the 16th: *opera*; the 17th: *serenade*; the 18th, 19th and 20th: nothing, because of the anniversary of the death of His Majesty the Emperor. ¹⁸ Monday *serenade etc. etc.*
