Milan, 27<sup>th</sup> *Feb.*, <u>1773</u>.

Today I cannot write more than a few words, for it is the last day of *Carnival*, and the fasting does not begin until tomorrow, so it is no different here [5] than if everyone were mad. In 2 or 3 days we set off. I am writing this to you as an enclosure with Herr Spitzeder's<sup>1</sup> letter so that you can say that you have not received any letters and therefore believe that we have already set off. We must, and want to, arrive in Salzburg on the 13<sup>th</sup> March,<sup>2</sup> on the evening of election day. Regarding that certain matter,<sup>3</sup> there is nothing that can be done. [10] I will tell you everything in person. God will have other plans for us. We are well, praise God. Today we are going to the *opera*,<sup>4</sup> in fact straight away, and to the *ball* afterwards, which begins 1 hour after midnight and lasts until Mass is heard in the morning. Pay the postage to Herr Spizeder right away. You cannot imagine the confusion [15] I am in myself because of our departure; I find it very difficult to leave Italy.<sup>5</sup>

I will make sure that I write to you again during the journey.
