## 0707. MOZART TO HIS FATHER, SALZBURG

Monsieur Leopold de Mozart / maitre de la Chapelle de S: A: R: / l'archeveque de et à / Salzbourg

Mon trés cher Pére!

<u>Vienne ce 26 d'october</u>  $[1782]^1$ 

However much I might wish to take the post-coach and fly to Salzburg *alla Wolfgang Mozart*, [5] it is however truly impossible, because |: without *ruining* a certain person :| I cannot get away from here before  $3^{rd}$  *November*, since Fräulein von Auerhammer<sup>2</sup> |: whom I have taken to stay with Baroness Waldstätten,<sup>3</sup> who is giving her board and *lodgings* :| is giving a *concert* in the theatre<sup>4</sup> on that day, and I have promised to play with her. – The infinite longing of myself and my wife to kiss your hands [10] and to embrace our dear sister will make us do everything possible to be able to enjoy this good fortune and pleasure at the first opportunity. – Enough; I cannot say any more in advance than that the month of *November* is not favourable for those Salzburg people who may not be able to tolerate my presence. – I also have many matters to discuss with you, my dearest father, concerning *musique*.

Having the *opera* stitched or bound<sup>5</sup> is all the same to me; I would have it bound with blue paper. From my handwriting you will gather that I must hurry horribly. It is already 7 o'clock, and despite all my sending to enquire, I received the letter<sup>6</sup> just this moment. – Now *adieu* – [20] I and my dear wife kiss your hands 1000 times, and embrace our dear sister from the heart, and are, sir, eternally your

most obedient children, W and C. Mozart
