I cannot possibly write much because we are just coming in from Baroness Waldstädten's,³ I must first change entirely from head to foot [5] because I have been invited to the *concert* given by Herr Spielmann, the court counsellor.⁴ – We both thank you for the New Year's Wish and freely confess ourselves to be oxen for completely forgetting our obligation – we therefore fulfil it in arrears and send no New Year's Wish, but send our general everyday wish – and we will leave the matter at that; – [10] as far as the *moral side* is concerned everything is entirely as it should be; – it was not without intention that it flowed from my pen – I have truly promised it in my heart,⁵ and also truly hope to keep it. – My wife was still single when I promised it – but since I was firmly resolved to marry her soon after her recuperation, I could promise it easily – [15] but time and circumstances thwarted our journey, as you know yourself; – but the score of half of a Mass, which is still lying there in the best of hopes, can serve as proof of the reality of my promise. –

Today I gained the elder *Countess Balfi*⁶ as a pupil, that is, the daughter <of the Archbishop's sister> – but I ask you to keep it to yourself for the moment [20], since I cannot know for certain if they are happy to have it known – The *symphony* from the last Hafner *musique* finished in Vienna: it is all the same to me whether in *score* or written out, for I must have it written out several times for my *concert* anyway. – I would also wish to have the following *symphonies*:

[30] things by Haydn⁹ with it, which I would like to have because of *Baron van Suiten*, ¹⁰ whom I visit every Sunday from 12 to 2 o'clock; – tell me, are there any *fugues* of significance in Haydn's *Mass settings*, or *vespers*, or both? – then you would oblige me greatly if you would have both things put into score little by little.

[35] Now I must close; – you will have received my last letter complete with the enclosure from the *Baroness*; ¹¹ – she has not told me what she wrote to you, but only that she had asked you for something relating to *musique*; – but she will certainly tell me as soon as I am out there again because she sees that I am not prying into it at all, [40] for she has a great deal of whimsy; – but I have heard at third hand that she would like to have a person for herself ¹² since she will be leaving – then I will only warn her that if this is true, you should watch what she is doing, because she is as <u>changeable</u> as the wind – and probably, regardless of what she imagines, she will find it difficult leaving Vienna; – [45] for she has been about to leave as long as I have had the honour of knowing her. – Now *adieu*, we kiss your hands 1000 times and embrace our dear sister from the heart and are, sir, eternally your
