My dearest Hofmeister! –

[Vienna, 20th November, 1785]

I seek refuge with you and I request you to come to my assistance with simply a little money in the meantime, since I need it most urgently at this moment. [5] – then I would ask you to make every effort to carry out that certain matter for me as soon as possible. –

Forgive me for constantly troubling you, but since you know me and know how important it is to me that your business should go well, I am perfectly convinced you will not take umbrage at my importunity, [10] but rather will be glad to be as helpful to me as I am to you.
