1136.¹ MOZART TO HIS WIFE, VIENNA OR BADEN BY VIENNA

Dearest little wife of my heart!

[Frankfurt, 30th September, 1790]

If only I already had a letter from you, I would feel everything was in order. - I hope you have received my letter from Efferding and the one from Frankfurt.² – in my last one I wrote saying you should speak to Redcurrant-Face;³ [5] – what I would most prefer, to be on the safe side, would be to receive 2000 florins as a *transfer* from H ;⁴ – but then you must pretend another reason for it, namely that I have a speculation in mind of which you know nothing; - My love! I can doubtless be sure of earning something here - but it will certainly not be as sure as you and various friends imagine. - I am well enough known and respected here, that much is sure. - Now - let us see. - But, whatever happens, I prefer to play a safe game, therefore I would like to do the business with H ,³ because that way I receive money and do not need to pay any, but simply work, and that is what I want to do, most willingly indeed, for the sake of my little wife. - [15] When you write to me, always write *poste restante*.⁵ – Where do you think I am staying? – in the same house as *Böhm*;⁶ and so is Hofer. – We are paying 30 guldens⁷ per month, and even this is exceptionally little.⁸ – We also have our board with them. Whom do you think I met here? - The girl with whom I so often played hide-and-seek in the Aug-Gottes⁹ – [20] her name was Buchner, I think. – Now her name is *Mad:^{me}* Porsch,¹⁰ and she has married for the second time. – She asked me to send you all best wishes from her when I write. -

Since I do not know if you are in Vienna or in Baaden,¹¹ I am *addressing* this letter to Hofer's wife¹² again. – I am looking forward like a child to being with to you again [25] – if people could see into my heart,¹³ I would almost have to be ashamed. – Everything is cold for me – ice-cold – Yes, if you were with me, I would perhaps find more pleasure in the charming behaviour of people towards me, – but, as it is, it is empty – *adieu* – love – I am eternally, Frankfurt am Main
