1167. MOZART TO HIS WIFE, BADEN¹ BY VIENNA

Dearest, most treasured little wife!

[Vienna, 24th or 25th June, 1791]²

I am writing only a little to you now, and in haste, because I am going to surprise³ Leitgeb⁴ and am going out to breakfast there – it is now half past 5 – after eating I will write to you again. [5] By then I also hope to have something to read from you. – adieu – I only wanted to say good morning to you, – take care of yourself – especially with the bathing – if you feel even only a little weak, stop at once – adieu – 2000 kisses –

Mozart.

To $Snai^5$ an arsefull of compliments – and he should apply himself diligently to vexing $X.Y.^6$ [10]

⁴ BD: Joseph (incorrectly Ignaz) Leutgeb (Leitgeb) (1732-1811), hunting horn player, one of the few people mentioned throughout the almost 30 years of correspondence (1763-1791). The large number of works written for him by Mozart speak for his musical abilities. Mozart made contact with him in 1781, shortly after arriving in Vienna. Leutgeb lived in a large house outside town; Mozart stayed there occasionally when his wife was taking spa treatment in Baden in 1791.
