I would have replied at once to your valued communications of 10^{th} and 21^{st} Fev.,⁴ [5] but that the demise of my most tenderly beloved husband, my own ensuing severe illness and then the inevitable, urgent domestic business had prevented me.

Now the *opera La finta Semplice* is already being copied,⁵ and since I am moving into town myself at Michaelmas,⁶ [10] I hope I can procure for you, by my presence directly there and by my efforts, more works by my brother than is presently the case. Yet until then you must certainly be patient, since my good friend⁷ in Salzburg has too much to do himself, so much so that he did not even answer to my letter of 28th March, but simply sent someone to tell me that the *opera* is already being copied. [15]

I have not yet handed in the payment order to Mayr's bookshop,⁸ since I still have almost 13 florins in guldens in my hands; if I need anything I will make use of this order.

What a joy it will be for me when you honour me with the gift of the score of the opera *Don Juan*.⁹ [20] I would only wish that I could obtain immediately and securely everything that you wish to have from my brother's works, but this is of course impossible for me; meanwhile I hope I will surely have persuaded you that I will still continue to make every effort, as I have done so far, to obtain everything little by little; I will make every effort to discover it. [25] I remain with great respect

[30] I cannot obtain the *operas* you are asking me for, *Endimion*,¹⁰ *Lucio Sylla*,¹¹ *assanio*,¹² *mitridate*, and *Bastien et Bastienne*; his widow must have the scores of these in her possession, and I do not know the other two¹³ at all. The copies of *Lucio Syla*, *assanio*, *mitridate*, are in Milan, where he composed them at the theatre.
