Most nobly born! Most highly estimable sir! Salzburg, 14th 10^{ber},⁴ 1802.

I am truly in very great perplexity as to whether you have received [5] the Vesper and Magnificat,⁵ 2 masses by Joseph and one by Michael Haydn which I sent off by post-coach on 28th Sept.,⁶ since so far I have received from you neither an answer to my communication of 20th Sept.⁷ nor any notification of your receipt of these pieces, when I had, after all, most urgently requested in my communication an answer to my questions. [10] I therefore cannot in fact understand your silence over such a long time, I therefore wish most longingly for an answer.

I also enclose herewith the opening bars of a mass⁸ which esteemed music director Gatti⁹ says is by my brother; if you do not yet have it, and desire it, write telling me; the esteemed music director will have it copied; [15] on the back of the note¹⁰ you can see what the copying charges amount to.

The person for whom I ordered the 11 volumes by my brother has already been asking me frequently whether he may soon receive the 12th volume;¹¹ I hope you will send it to me as soon as possible.

Furthermore, a Herr Metzger, a merchant from here, asks to be sent my brother's [20] works for *clavier* as well as those by Haydn on *subscription*; I therefore ask you to send me at once the already published volumes by both my brother and Haydn, at the same time noting separately the expenses involved so that I have proof.

I am infinitely sorry that I have not been able to send you any new *compositions* by [25] my brother for such a long time, but since you still have, I hope, a sufficient supply of them, it will be easy for you to wait for them, since despite all efforts, I am finding it very difficult to track down anything; rest assured of my diligent efforts, with which I am always, Most nobly born Sir!
